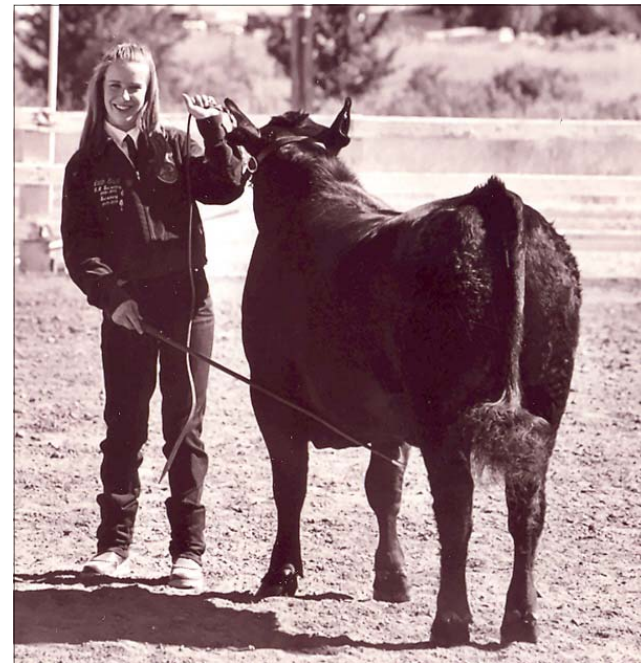

## ROUND ROBIN SHOWMANSHIP

Only first place showmen of the showmanship classes may compete in the Round Robin Showmanship. If an individual has won first place in more than one showmanship class, he/she will select the class he/she wishes to represent in the Round Robin. In the other class in which he/she won, the second place showman will represent the class in Round Robin.

In the Novice 4-H, Junior 4-H, Senior 4-H and FFA Round Robin Showmanship classes each participant will show horse, poultry, rabbit, beef, goat, sheep and swine. The winner is to be determined by his/her ability to show all species. Judging in all Round Robin Showmanship divisions will begin at 12:00 pm.

This award is for the highest placing market beef, goat, sheep and swine entry that is born and raised on an operation headquartered in Modoc County which may also encompass bordering property in Lake County, OR; Lassen County, CA; and Washoe County, NV.

Within each market class, animals are to be entered in either Section 1 or Section 2. Section 1 is for animals born and raised on an operation headquartered in Modoc County which may also encompass bordering property in Lake County, OR; Lassen County, CA; and Washoe County, NV. Section 2 is for animals born and raised by a livestock operation outside of Modoc County.

## PEE WEE SHOWMANSHIP

Open to boys and girls Kindergarten through 3rd grade, as of January 1 of the current year, and must reside in an area served by a Modoc County 4-H Club. Pee Wee Showmanship will be divided into two groups, Kindergarten & 1st graders and 2nd & 3rd graders.

Animals to be shown by children may include dogs, cats, rats, mice, cavies, poultry and rabbits. All animals will be shown together. The animals must have been trained by the exhibitor and may NOT be entered in any other division of the Junior Livestock Show. Animals entered in this class are to be brought to the grounds shortly before showing and removed soon after.

Entries are due May 15th at the Modoc 4-H Office.

## SWINE DIVISION

### RULES

1. Market hog—barrow or gilt in the exhibitor's possession and on feed 60 days prior to the opening date of show and identified with a JLS tag by April 10, 2007.
2. Market hog—minimum weight is 200 pounds and exhibitors will not be paid for more than 270 pounds.
3. Market hogs will be graded and ribbons awarded as indicated.

#### MARKET READY

US No 1 and No 2 hogs of average or greater conformation that are acceptable in leanness, muscularity and production traits. Eligible to sell. Market ready animals will be broken down into Group 1 (Blue Ribbon) and Group 2 (Red Ribbon) by the judge based on quality of the animals for sale purposes only.

#### NOT MKT. READY

Any hogs of below average conformation including US No 3, No 4 and utility grade hogs. Not eligible to sell. White Ribbon.

4. Feeder hog class—open to all market hogs weighing 60 to 199 pounds. Animals not originally intended for sale at the Junior Livestock Show need not be tagged. Animals originally intended for sale at the Junior Livestock Show that did not make weight can enter the feeder class Wednesday evening at the scales.

## GENERAL LIVESTOCK SHOW RULES

1. All participants must be a member of a Modoc County 4-H Council 4-H Club, or a members of the Alturas, Big Valley or Surprise Valley FFA Chapters.
2. Primary 4-H members (5 to 8 years old or Kindergarten to 3rd grade) may compete in the Poultry and Rabbit classes specifically designated for them. They will receive participation ribbons only.
3. 4-H and FFA members may participate in no more than one Junior Livestock Sale following graduation from high school.
4. Livestock not properly trained, fed, groomed and healthy or those who pose a safety hazard are subject to being sifted from competition and removed from the show grounds.
5. Barn and stall space will only be provided for beef, goats, sheep and swine entered in the show by 4-H and FFA members.
6. Each exhibitor must furnish his/her own equipment and feed. Initial bedding will be provided.
7. In an effort to make this a family friendly event, no alcohol will be allowed on the show grounds.
8. In order to reduce fire hazard, smoking will be restricted to the east parking lot away from the barns and house trailers.
9. Roping will only be allowed across the road in the roping arena, not around the show rings and barns.
10. Exhibits are entered at owner's risk.

11. All 4-H and FFA members are prohibited from possessing or using alcoholic beverages or drugs, using obscene language, rough-housing, destroying property, or insubordination when on show grounds, including show rings, barns, and house trailers. Infractions as determined by a responsible adult or Junior Show Board member may result in any or all of the following penalties: disqualification of member and animal from show and sale, assessing member the cost of damages, and/or releasing member to the appropriate law enforcement agency.
12. Entries for all classes must be submitted to the Modoc 4-H Office by the responsible 4-H Leader or FFA Advisor by 5:00 pm on May 8, 2007.
13. Each 4-H Club and FFA Chapter must include a \$50 stall fee with their entries or exhibitors will not be entered. The fee will be returned if all stalls and adjacent areas are cleaned by 11:00 am on Saturday, June 16, 2007, and the club/chapter trash can has been emptied during the week of show.
14. Novice 4-H classes are open to members who are in the 4th & 5th grades during the current school year. Junior 4-H classes are open to members enrolled in the 6-8th grades during the current school year. Senior 4-H classes are open to members in the 9-12th grades during the current school year.
15. Each exhibitor may have no more than two market entries in each market class.
16. No animal may be entered in both market and breeding classes.
17. Entry fees are as follows:

18. Copies of registration papers must accompany entry forms.

7. All sheep require individual identification. The official identification may be official USDA individual identification ear tags, Scrapies Flock Certification Program ear tags, or registration tattoos if accompanied by registration papers. Market lambs will be checked at weigh-in. Breeding sheep will be checked Thursday prior to the first breeding sheep class.

## SHEEP DIVISION

### RULES

1. Market lamb—wether or ewe lamb in exhibitor's possession and on feed 60 days prior to the opening date of show and identified with a JLS tag by April 10, 2007.
2. Market lamb—minimum weight for lambs is 105 pounds and exhibitors will not be paid for more than 140 pounds.
3. Market lambs will graded and ribbons awarded as indicated.

#### MARKET READY

USDA Prime or Choice quality grade with 12th rib backfat range of .16 to .35 inch and average or better conformation and cutability. Eligible to sell. Market ready animals will be broken down into Group 1 (Blue Ribbon) and Group 2 (Red Ribbon) by the judge based on q quality of the animals for sale purposes only.

#### NOT MKT. READY

USDA Good or lower quality grade with 12th rib backfat range of <.16 or >.35 inch; underfinished lambs grading USDA Good or lower; below-average conformation or cutability. Not eligible to sell. White ribbon.

4. Lambs may not carry more than one inch of stretched fleece at any point on their bodies. It is recommended that lambs be sheared after May 1st.
5. Callipyge lambs (heavy muscled) can not be part of the sale and will be sifted.
6. Feeder lamb class—open to all market lambs weighing 75 to 104 pounds. Animals not originally intended for sale at the Junior Livestock Show need not be tagged. Animals originally intended for sale at the Junior Livestock Show that did not make weight can enter the feeder class Wednesday evening at the scales.

19. 4-H members will wear the following uniform during all classes, the awards ceremony, and the auction: dark blue jeans, white collared shirt that is long enough to tuck in, 4-H tie or scarf, and 4-H hat.
20. FFA members will wear the following uniform during all classes, the awards ceremony, and the auction: black pants, white shirt, FFA tie or scarf, and FFA jacket.
21. Horse show competitors may wear breeches in English classes in place of blue jeans.
22. Rabbit competitors may wear an apron over their uniform.
23. Members are required to do their own work with their animals and stalls. They may receive limited assistance from current members who are 2006 graduates or younger. Adults may assist with verbal advice only. An infraction of this rule will cause members and animals to be disqualified. Junior Show Board members must be notified of an infraction in writing.
24. Each exhibitor shall show his/her animal in accordance with the schedule and may be disqualified for failure to do so.
25. Awarding of all champion ribbons and trophies will be the decision of the judges.
26. An exhibitor may have only one Grand or Reserve Champion market animal for the show. If an exhibitor has two animals in consideration for Grand and Reserve Champion, and the judge selects one of the exhibitor's entries for Grand Champion, the exhibitor must withdraw the second animal. Grand and Reserve Champions must grade Group 1.
27. Exhibitors in horse showmanship must show the horse in at least one other class at the Junior Livestock Show.
28. The Junior Show Board will decide all disputes and decisions not covered by the rules.

29. The Junior Show Board reserves the right to divide or combine classes beyond the sections listed if deemed appropriate.
30. All animals are subject to use in the judging contest.
31. No exhibitor may sell at this sale who has sold at another junior livestock sale in the current calendar year with the exception of statewide shows.
32. To be eligible to show and sell market beef, goats, sheep, and swine animals must have been tagged and recorded by a Junior Show Board member by February 13, 2007 for beef and April 10, 2007 for goats, sheep, and swine. Exhibitors are responsible for notifying Junior Show Board members of animals to be tagged.
33. All market beef, goats, sheep and swine are to arrive at the show grounds on Wednesday, June 13, 2007.
34. Market animals will be weighed only once.
35. Market beef, goats and sheep will be weighed in from 4:00 to 6:00 pm.
36. Market hogs will be weighed in starting at 6:00 pm. Hog weigh in will be done pen by pen. Only the swine project members & Junior Show Board members are allowed in the swine barn during weigh in. No washing or decorating during hog weigh in.
37. To be eligible to sell, market beef, goats, sheep and swine must grade Market Ready. Meat birds and rabbits must grade Group 1 or Group 2.
38. Photos must be taken immediately following market classes. If a member fails to have their photo taken for their buyer's card, their check will be held until a photo is provided to the Modoc 4-H Office.

39. Sale order will be determined by the judge's placing all sale animals in rank of grade.
40. For exhibitor's with more than one market entry, the highest placing animal will be entered in the sale order, unless the Modoc 4-H Office is notified in writing by the exhibitor by 5:00pm on Thursday June 14, 2007.
41. Non-sale animals may be removed after the last market class on Thursday.
42. To be eligible to sell, every 4-H and FFA member must participate in a showmanship class.
43. Each exhibitor may sell only one animal at the Modoc County Junior Livestock Sale per year.
44. Non drugged animals may go through the sale. USDA meat inspectors sample show animals for residues of antibiotics, sedatives and tranquilizers. Sellers of condemned carcasses must return the payment or replace the carcass and are liable for triple civil damages and fines.
45. A 5% commission will be charged against all sale animals to support the show and sale.
46. Members will receive their check when their buyer has paid for their animal. All checks will be mailed to the appropriate 4-H Leader or FFA Advisor. Be sure to write and send thank you notes to buyers.
47. Exhibitors of all breeding stock must own animal 60 days prior to the show or be the breeder of the animal.
48. Breeding animals may arrive and leave the day they are to be shown.
49. Registered animals may not be entered in grade classes.
50. In grade breeding classes, sire determines breed.

## BEEF DIVISION

### RULES

1. Market beef—steer or heifer not over 20 months of age when shown and in exhibitor's possession and on feed 120 days prior to the opening date of show, and identified with a JLS tag by February 13, 2007.
2. Market beef—minimum weights for market beef is 950 pounds and exhibitors will not be paid for more than 1250 pounds.
3. Market beef will be graded and ribbons awarded as indicated.

### MARKET READY

Market steers projected to have sufficient fat deposition to meet the marbling specifications for USDA Prime, Choice or Select + quality grades. Eligible to sell. Market ready animals will be broken down into Group 1 (Blue Ribbon) and Group 2 (Red Ribbon) by the judge based on quality of the animals for sale purposes only.

### NOT MKT. READY

Market steers lacking evidence of sufficient fat deposition to produce a desirable consumer product. Steers projected to grade USDA Select Minus or lower. Not eligible to sell. White Ribbon.

4. Feeder beef class—open to all market beef weighing 700 to 949 pounds. Animals not originally intended for sale at the Junior Livestock Show need not be tagged. Animals originally intended for sale at the Junior Livestock Show that did not make weight can enter the feeder class Wednesday evening at the scales.
5. Nose rings or nose tongs will not be allowed.
6. Horns may be no longer than 4 inches.

Market ready animals will be broken down into Group 1 (Blue Ribbon) and Group 2 (Red Ribbon) by the judge based on quality of the animals for sale purposes only.

### NOT MKT. READY

Good or lower quality grade with 12th rib back fat range <.08 or >.22; underfinished goats grading USDA Good or lower, below average conformation or cutability. Not eligible to sell. White Ribbon.

5. Feeder goat class—open to all market goats weighing 35 to 64 pounds. Animals not originally intended for sale at the Junior Livestock Show need not be tagged. Animals originally intended for sale at the Junior Livestock Show that did not make weight can enter the feeder class Wednesday evening at the scales.

## HORSE DIVISION

### RULES

1. Exhibitors of all horses must have owned or worked with the horse shown at least 60 days prior to the show. The leader's signature on the entry form is taken as proof.
2. ASTM approved helmets with chin straps secured are required for anyone on a horse in or out of the arena during the entire show.
3. All riders must bring their helmet to registration to be checked. If the helmet is not ASTM certified, the rider will not be allowed to show.
4. Riders will be disqualified for cruel or inhumane treatment of their horse as determined by the Junior Show Board.
5. At the Horse Show on Monday, 4-H Project Leaders and FFA Advisors will be allowed to assist members with saddling and holding the horse while the member bridles it. Leaders will not be allowed to help with anything else. Older members may assist based on General Livestock Rule #23.
6. Horse patterns will be posted. No demonstrations will be allowed.
7. In showmanship classes, use of a chain chin piece on lead rope is allowed at the judge's discretion.
8. Class #7 Section #1, Western Equitation Walk-Trot is open to first and second year horse project members only. Members who enter this class are also allowed to enter showmanship and halter classes. They can not enter regular English, bareback, western or gymkhana classes.
9. In western classes a hackamore, curb, snaffle, half-breed, or spade bit are permissible. However, horses must be shown in what is appropriate for their age.

10. Chain chin straps are permissible but must be at least one-half inch in width, and must lie flat against the jaw of the horse. No wire chin straps regardless of how padded or covered. No chin straps narrower than one-half inch will be allowed.
11. Martingales, nosebands, and tie-downs are prohibited in performance classes.
12. Tie-downs are allowed in gymkhana classes only.
13. Gymkhana riders have one minute to enter the arena and start their pattern after their name has been announced. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.
14. High point awards will be based on a member's placing in all classes on a single horse in a specific division. One horse for the performance classes and one horse for the gymkhana classes is allowed.
