**VEGETABLES TO PLANT FOR FALL HARVEST\*\***

**Root crops from seed:**

**Carrots**

- Nantes
- Danvers
- Imperator (long types)



**Cole crops from transplants:**

- Cabbage
- Cauliflower
- Broccoli
- Brussel Sprouts



**Beets**

- Early Wonder Green Top
- Detroit Dark Red

**Leafy crops:**

- All leaf lettuce
- Swiss Chard
- Radicchio
- Collards
- Endive
- Kale
- Kohlrabi

**Turnips**

- Purple Top

**Radishes**

All types – should plant a week apart through early October

**Peas:**

- Progress #9 (bush type)
- Super Sugar Snap
