The University of California Cooperative Extension (UCCE) office in Alameda County will have available a number of internships and volunteer opportunities in broad areas of Horticulture, Food Security, Youth Development, Physical Activity and Nutrition. UCCE in Alameda County offers both graduate and upper division undergraduate students an opportunity to apply their knowledge and skills in the community, solving issues related to agriculture, environment, and health. Internship and volunteer opportunities are designed to improve skills and knowledge of interns. At the conclusion of the internship period, interns will be expected to submit a report summarizing their experiences.

Applications can be submitted by e-mail and will be forwarded to prospective mentors. A brief summary of each internship position is available and will be posted on the UCCE of Alameda County website.
